Part of the American dream is that practically anything we want to do is within reach provided we want it enough. A career choice can include practically anything, ranging from the ordinary to the extra-ordinary, from the unique to the bizarre.

In our initial conversation with a woman applying to live at the *Home for Mothers*, we try to discover whether she has any goals in life and if she has made (or is making) plans to pursue them. We've heard some laudable career goals by our residents: medical assistant, medical billing and coding, paralegal, massage therapy, etc. We try to help them stay on course to "be what you want to be, do what you want to do." It takes some persistence and perseverance on their part to reach their goal so they can take better care of their family.

But there is something else that we try to interject into the process for the residents that's a proper and God-pleasing motivation for whatever they are doing or plan to do. It's as the Apostle John says, "We love because He first loved us." The Apostle Paul put it this way: "Whether you eat

or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." Our residents don't always appreciate (or even know) the crucified and risen Savior. Through our devotions and Bible studies we try to add that wonderful and essential ingredient of God-pleasing motivation to whatever plans they may have in their future.

For some of our New Beginnings residents, birthdays weren't a festive occasion until they came here. One resident in particular had never had a special birthday celebration. There weren't any birthday cards or presents. Her mother never baked her a birthday cake. It was just like any other day.

At New Beginnings we try to stress a family approach by eating together, having a family devotion at the end of a meal, enjoying each other's company, and the like. We try to make at least the major holidays a special event.

In our home when our own children were growing up, they could ask Mom to make any kind of dessert they wanted for their birthday. It may have been chocolate cake, fruit pizza, apple pie – just about anything. This family tradition has been incorporated into New Beginnings' life. There have been requests by the residents for cheesecake, pie, mint surprise cookies, special cakes; the list goes on and on! When the birthday girl or boy is a little child, he or she usually gets chocolate cake and ice cream. It's so much fun to watch a one-year-old get the chocolate all over his face and hair — and let someone else do the clean-up!

We also make a personalized birthday card on the computer for each resident and her child on their birthday and sing "Happy Birthday." These are all simple things to celebrate which you and I probably took for granted when we were growing up. Of course you would get at least a couple of birthday cards, and of course you would have "Happy Birthday" sung to you on your special day. For these women and their children though, this is often a new experience and one they will cherish.

Memories are pretty important in life — especially when they're fond memories of your childhood. Every child should have some fond memories in life, and at New Beginnings we try to plant some seeds in residents' minds to include birthdays among the happy and good memories.
