
"Will you assume this ministry in the confidence that it comes from God, who speaks to you through the call of his Church?"

# DO NOT DISPOSE

"Rrrrrr!" "Ka-chunk! Ka-chunk!"

"Rrrrrr!" "Boomp!" Every week

it's always the same. One becomes

accustomed to it as a ritual for living in

affluent America. The ritual is called

"trash pickup." This ritual takes place

once items have lost their value and

usefulness. Once the bottles are emptied,
the content of cans is consumed,
newspapers are read and then used
to wrap refuse the ritual takes place.

These useless, valueless items find their
way into the dumpster and are then
disgracefully loaded into the trash
hauler's truck and taken to the dump.

It's not only bottles, cans, and dirty diapers that are treated with such disrespect and disdain. Sometimes lives are treated as nothing more than valueless refuse, suitable only for the ritual of "Rrrrr!" "Ka-chunk!" "Ka-boomp!" The growth, the embryo, is robbed by definition of its dignity, being redefined into something that has neither life nor value to others. It is often of little moral significance to many in today's world whether that "growth" continues to exist and find some purpose in life's future, or if it is discarded as in the ritual of the dumpster.

Thankfully that's not the mindset of six young women who reside at *New Beginnings – A Home for Mothers*. Though they have found themselves in a difficult situation, the thought of disposing of that which dwelled in their wombs was never a consideration. Each young woman could have easily concluded that this "growth" within her body would be of no value to improve her life. Rather than viewing this

"growth" within as a life to be nurtured, they could have easily concluded it was simply a burden, and better to dispose of it.

While the weekly "Rrrrr-Ka-chunk-Ka-boomp" ritual of the trash hauler signifies the removal of the worthless and the useless deposited in the dumpster outside, within the walls of *New Beginnings* there are sounds and rituals that place great



value on life. Within these walls there is an excitement and joy over each life that God has given, whether dwelling within the womb, or quietly napping on Mom's lap. Whether it's the soft giggles of the four infants held by their mothers as others tickle and coo at them; or if it's the gentle words of comfort from a mom to ease the discomfort of her precious child, the sounds and thoughts of disposal are far from the hearts and lips of these young women.

Even while life is yet developing in the womb, the excitement of seeing that life through grainy photos reflects an attitude that says: "Here is God-given life, which He has entrusted to me for now. What a privilege, and what a joy!" The conversation at the dinner table or in the

TV room crackles with an energy and joy over life. In their eyes, from their words, by the gentle touch of loving hands each mother reflects that sense of awe and privilege in caring for this gift from God.

Is every mother and child, every life and every day at New Beginnings trouble-free and without sin? Everyone knows the answer to that question. Their problems are just like the problems of every other sinner. They worry about health issues; and squabble over what is really insignificant. Every sinner's struggle dwells within their daily lives, sometimes more than most. But this is literally "a new beginning"! It is the opportunity to learn how to better recognize sin and its subsequent sorrows. It is the gift of being reminded daily to call upon God for help in resisting sin. New Beginnings offers the opportunity to share and live with their precious children in the peace known only in Jesus' life and death. While troubled by sin, their days also progress in the hope of life in Jesus, today and forever. With one another they have opportunity to practice their mutual forgiveness, love and encouragement which they have experienced first from

The "Rrrr!" "Ka-chunk!" "Rrrrr!" "Ka-boomp!" are still heard weekly here at New Beginnings — outside. What is carried away in that vehicle is waste, trash, now void of usefulness. However, what remains within the walls of New Beginnings is respect of life, joy in God's blessings and peace in Jesus' loving care.




