The gentle "clip-clop" of the donkey echoed on the quiet streets as the anguished mother and worried

father searched door-to-door for shelter. It had been a long journey for a woman

in her final month of pregnancy. There was no family to turn to for shelter in this unfamiliar town. Hospitals with advanced neo-natal and birthing clinics did not

exist. There was just one inn, with a manager who would listen to them. He had a stable with all the aromatic ambiance of cows, chickens, donkeys and molding hay. Though warm from the body heat of the animals, it certainly was not the sterile and pleasant environment of today's birthing suites in the hospitals.

Their child would be born and with Him there would be many "firsts." He would be Mary's first child, God's one and only Son; He would be the first child born of a virgin; it would be the first (and only) time



angels delivered the birth announcement; it would be the first time a star, not Google, gave directions to the child's location for those who would visit him. It was the first of what we now call "Christmas." The God-child, Jesus, came into this world as the angel said to the shepherds: "Today in the town of David, a Savior has been born to

Birth is the first step of a cycle so familiar to everyone: birth, life and then death. Each one is born, each person lives in this world for a time, and then, everyone dies. Jesus began this cycle that night, His first night, in the town of Bethlehem. He would be the first to have God the Father speak from heaven at His baptism - "with him I am well pleased." He would be the first to speak with an authority never heard before by prophet or teacher of the Law. He would not need to say: "God says,..." but would be able to tell them: "I say to you...." His would be the first perfect, sinless life; and the first and only death capable of paying for the sins of the world. He would be the first to hang on a cross, fully innocent of any wrongdoing and wondering of His Father – "Why have you forsaken me?" It would be the first time God's innocent Son shed His precious blood for the world.


