It is often a lonely time, when the feelings of banishment and abandonment are there, whether real or imagined. There are an endless number of stories throughout the history of the world. Who can forget David and Bathsheba? A chosen ruler of God's people, a "man after God's own heart" and yet he

stumbled and fell to the temptation of his own fleshly lusts. The reader of 2 Samuel 11 is often appalled at how far into the depths of evil David fell while trying to solve his predicament. Murder and deception were not beyond his imagination. Surely, when Bathsheba told

him the news – "I'm pregnant" – the question arose for him: "Now what?" Today millions of women in the same situation – pregnant outside of the bonds of marriage – face the same question: "Now what?" Answerless questions swirl through their hearts and minds: "How can I afford this?" "Who will help me?" "Can I manage caring for a baby as a single mother, without a spouse?"

"Am I old enough to care for a baby?" "Am I too old to safely give birth to a baby?" It is often at this time, with those questions overwhelming their minds, that a woman appears at the doorstep of New Beginnings. These mothers have wrestled with each of those questions and

more. They have been encouraged, advised, even threatened to have an abortion. For each of them abortion was not the answer to that question, "Now what?" Instead they knew that what was growing within them was life – God's gift of life. But the uncertainties are still there – "Now what?" "Can I...?" "Will we...?"

But Mommy and I have a nice place to live. She's got a good place to work now, so we can really have our own place some day. (But Mommy

keeps tell'n everyone we're never leavin' *New Beginnings*.) She's also gonna go to school, maybe before I do, to learn how to help people that have the same thing she calls "adikshuns" like she had. She'll be real good at that.

Every night Mommy reads to me from a book she calls the "Bible." Those stories are real good. They tell me how much God loves me 'n Mommy. Hey, did I tell you I got baptized by Jesus? Yup, He took away what Mommy calls 'sin.' That's my

"How could I keep a roof over his head, daycare, diapers, baby food, etc.?" "My grandma sent me \$10 and I had to buy prenatal vitamins ... I needed to find a job but how? I was only 16 and had to go to school." Fewer replied: "I didn't have any fears. I was happy. I didn't worry about money because we both worked."

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# Concerning health...


"My lifestyle was not conducive to pregnancy...I drank and did drugs and didn't eat or sleep much." "I was worried because I did drugs while pregnant but I got clean and the pregnancy was perfect."

Concerning family...

"Nobody at first jumped on the band wagon, but as they saw that I cared, they began to care..." "I lied to my Mom. I then had to come out and tell the truth. My mom was shamed in front of the family." "I wasn't talking to my family at the time. I moved away. No one knew I was pregnant 'til I was 7 months along." And yet for some families,

"...all of my family were happy, nobody was disappointed at all." Often the father is either in prison, or simply is not there for his child. A few have fathers who keep in touch and help out.

Thankfully, for some the conclusion is there that: "My regrets are deep. I wish I would have done things the way God intended because my children would have had a whole family and I would have had a husband that loved me, helped me. It's hard when you're all alone." "It's hard raising a baby, especially when you're a single, struggle'n mother. I have to play both parents. But I don't regret my son. He's my unplanned blessing who saved my life." At New Beginnings we pray that each mother can be helped to answer those questions positively,, and reach the same conclusion concerning her and her child as this mother wrote: "I know that God is with me and is going to get me through all my obstacles...God will take care of me and my baby..." That confidence is possible only because of God's gracious love in our risen Savior, Jesus, who has given us the victory over all that would destroy us! In Him we have an answer to the question, "Now what?"
