A Practical Makeover

Makeovers seem to be an everyday occurrence for women in today's world. Keeping up with the latest fashions, hairstyles and beauty products is no easy task. Many of these items may help to create a more self-confident attitude about oneself.

However, at *New Beginnings — A Home for Mothers* the focus is on a makeover that provides the necessary skills to create a self-sufficient and God-pleasing life for the residents and their children.

When the residents arrive at *New Beginnings* they have made the decision that they are ready for a change in their life. A makeover is needed because they have been blessed with a child. With an infant in the picture, their past lifestyle will no longer cut it.

Upon arrival at New Beginnings, a resident is asked to write down three or four goals that she will pursue during her stay. Some focus on obtaining their high school diploma or GED. Others will attend a twoyear college to learn vocational skills. Some will seek employment that will allow them to live comfortably and become financially stable. Still others look closer to home and strive to be a good housekeeper and cook. All the residents aspire to be loving mothers, whether

that involves taking on the responsibility of parenting or making the tough decision to place their child in an adoptive home.

Many people wouldn't give goals such as these a second thought. The residents here, however, haven't had the proper training to become the heads of their newfound households. These are challenging goals that take many small steps to conquer.

The first steps to attaining these goals can be as minor as a change of schedule, or perhaps creating a schedule for the first time. That is followed by learning how to cook a meal for a family, keeping an apartment clean, taking care of a baby and doing a load of laundry. A critical part of their makeover involves a hard look at their social circle. Bad influences can derail good intentions and finding supportive friends goes a long way toward a successful makeover.

Many of our residents are still young ladies who struggle in a society that values ungodly things. Fortunately *New* Beginnings helps to point them to the things of God. They are focusing on makeovers that are truly worthwhile and will give them the skills to become the Christian heads of their household.


