

Teamwork By Liz Seelow

Anyone who has participated in a team sport knows about teamwork. Getting the job done requires a coordinated effort that places the needs of the team above the needs of the individual. It may be tempting to follow the credo that you had better do it yourself if you want it done right, but that won't wash in a team sport. Success will always be elusive until the entire group learns to come together and function as one. This team mentality is also important for the residents and staff at *New Beginnings*. In order for a program like *New*

Beginnings to run successfully and smoothly, the women must work together as a team.

The members of a football team have to learn to trust each other in order to reach their full potential. Only through mutual respect and trust will they become comfortable enough to give 100-percent effort in their assigned tasks. The residents also learn to trust. They learn that their newfound home is a place where they can bring their troubles and concerns to the table and know that it won't go any further than that. It takes trust to speak frankly and honestly. Honest discussion is critical in dealing with parenting troubles, relationship issues, concerns in the workplace and other challenges to their faith.

Every member of a football team has a specific job. Here at *New Beginnings* the residents are also assigned specific chores. By working as a team they make the building clean and livable. The sense of pride and accomplishment they feel would not be possible without teamwork.

The members of a football team are assigned to a specific unit. They might play on offense or defense or special teams. Each athlete belongs to a team within a team. In a similar way, our residents belong to a smaller "team" — their own small family. They are now learning

the leadership skills of a parent by taking care of themselves and their child. This is truly an awesome responsibility. Each parent is guided and coached to become better and better at the job.

Thankfully, when all is said and done, we have a constant on our team — Jesus. Only by grace are we able to work together in Christian love and unity. We have the comfort of Jesus' forgiveness when we falter and the assurance that Jesus will give us strength as we work as a team to live for Him. It is said that the great coaches are great teachers. Jesus is the greatest teacher, but He is more than that. He is more than a coach or an example or a mere motivator. He is our Savior! 🕼
