For more than 20 years, we have shared the story of New Beginnings - A Home for Mothers with you. This unique ministry of Christian Life Resources accepted its first resident at its Colorado location in October of 1993. Since then we have served hundreds of mothers and their newborn babies.

The time has come for New Beginnings to have its own new beginning. By action of the National Board of Christian Life Resources, we will relocate the New Beginnings' ministry from Colorado to southeastern Wisconsin. We are looking at this move for the following reasons:

- 1. To serve more mothers at one time;
- 2. To offer access to a larger volunteer resource base;
- 3. To operate more economically because of the closer proximity to the CLR headquarters;

4. To explore better outreach opportunities with our mentoring program.

We expect to close our Colorado operations at the end of summer 2014. The timing coincides with plans by our Assistant Home Manager, Mollie Schultz, who is leaving to pursue additional schooling. Also, our Home Manager, Heidi Westlund, announced that she would like to pursue other ventures in Colorado starting the end of the summer. So the timing is right.

New beginnings can be both painful and exciting at the same time. I am excited at the prospect of reaching more people with the Gospel. Please help us make this "new beginning" with your generous gifts and prayers.

Here We Grow... With the Encouragement of Others

On February 13, 2014, we celebrated yet another milestone in New Beginnings' history as Kelsey, already a graduate of our residency program, became the first graduate of our mentoring program! The mentoring program was established in June 2012 in an effort to assist graduates of our residency program to make a more gradual and therefore more successful transition from our program back into the real world. In the mentoring program, graduating residents (mentees) are paired with adult volunteers (mentors) who provide Christian support, guidance and encouragement while holding them accountable as they learn to navigate living on their own.

In this particular situation, Kelsey was paired with Judi Sullivan who has been a long-time supporter of New Beginnings and whose husband, Jack Sullivan, is a current board member. As with most new relationships, theirs started out slowly and somewhat awkwardly. A call here, a text message there, and then they had their first official meeting. Judi met Kelsey and her son, Adam, at a local park and as they visited and shared life experiences a bond quickly began to develop. After just two short months, Kelsey would call Judi out of the blue just to say hello, to share good news about work or to tell her about something new that Adam had learned. After almost two years, Kelsey, Adam, Judi and Jack have become more like family than mentees and mentors. They have helped each other through many life experiences: car accidents, surgeries, illnesses, new

jobs, promotions, relationships, etc. One would be hard pressed to find anyone more supportive of the mentoring program than Kelsey and Judi. Judi will be the first to tell you that she feels like she has received much more from the mentoring program than she has given – although I think Kelsey would beg to differ!

Since she entered the mentoring program, Kelsey has started a career in banking. She began as a teller, was promoted three times, and was given numerous bonuses over the past 16 months. She has also been living on her own (selfsufficient) for a year and a half and has been in a healthy relationship with her boyfriend, Terrance, for over a year. In addition, Kelsey is a member at Christ our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Aurora, Colorado. Kelsey has not only turned her life around, she proactively looks for opportunities to share her story, experiences and faith with others. We recently received the following email regarding Kelsey:

Here We Grow... As We See Through God's Eyes

A few years ago, my college schedule was such that I had to do a lot of my grocery shopping in the late hours of the night at a nearby 24-hour food store. The patrons of that particular store could have been considered "unsavory characters" — at least at first glance. Many nights, for example, it was not uncommon for me to see parents with young children shopping alongside me — at a time well beyond what a responsible parent would consider a "proper" bed time.

Yet, my initial judgment of these families completely clouded my viewpoint of them. I forgot to consider that these families were just as busy as I was. Perhaps they were about to start their third-shift job, or were just getting off from their second job and trying to squeeze in a little amount of time with their child. I realized I had jumped to conclusions; I hadn't looked at others at face value.

The same can be said of my initial thoughts of New Beginnings. I had developed an idea of what to expect, what kinds of experiences I would have, what kind of people I would meet. Such expectations were completely unfounded. Each of the residents are unique individuals: each from very different

backgrounds and each in their own unique situations. I discovered those generalizations and assumptions were unwarranted.

The ease with which I have jumped to conclusions in my own life makes me certain that others have done the same to me. This leads me to wonder what assumptions people make about me when they see me. Do I appear likeable or disagreeable? Has anyone just looked at me and thought, "He must be a Christian"? Matthew 5:16 tells us, "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." What better way to let one's light shine than to accept every person we encounter with a loving, Christ-like attitude! Those people who appear in our earthly eyes to be "unsavory characters" are often those who need our Christian love the most. They are the "least of these brothers" mentioned in Matthew 25:40.

So I pray, as Christians, we can remove the shaded lenses that have darkened our eyes in our assumptions about others. May we instead see people through God's eyes so they, in turn, can see God through us.


