Although the desperation of their circumstances and need for a fresh start might seem more apparent than our own, if we are honest with ourselves, we are all in need of a new beginning in some aspect of our lives - whether it be with a relationship, career, self-image or even a hobby. Few things are as impactful here at New Beginnings as volunteers, quest speakers or supporters who share their own struggles and triumphs with our mothers.

God blessed Adam and me with them, as the completion to our family. God has truly blessed me in every way, and I hope His healing, through me, can guide others to hope too.
